Volonté + Action = SUCCÈS

Voilà donc une équation simple et compliquée à la fois! Une réflexion ordinaire, mais combien problématique pour la majorité d'entre nous. Pourtant, la base même de la vie de l'être humain, repose sur un amalgame inconditionnel des deux premières données de cette équation (*Volonté et Action*) qui mène indubitablement vers l'objectif visé (le *Succès*).

Pour nous qui avons une certaine connaissance de la Bible, nous savons que Dieu nous a créés avec le **libre arbitre**, c'est-à-dire la propriété qu'a la volonté humaine de se déterminer, de penser et d'agir librement. Basé sur cette assertion, nous pouvons dire avec certitude que Dieu n'est nullement responsable de notre condition. Cette réflexion n'est pas le fruit du hasard, mais plutôt suscitée par ce constat de notre improductivité en tant que communauté, peuple ou nation. D'où vient cette caractéristique plutôt rare d'une société (la nôtre) qui se complait aisément dans la nonchalance, l'inertie, voire même la médiocrité à outrance qui fait de nous le paria et la risée du monde?



Beaucoup d'entre nous ont traversé les frontières pour être témoins de la façon dont vit et évolue l'être humain, mais peu d'entre nous ont compris et appris. Bien au contraire, nous avons même transporté avec nous cette mentalité de petit peuple, incapable de transcender les choses les plus rudimentaires pour se mettre au diapason avec le reste du monde. Nous sommes toujours à la remorque des prétendus bienfaiteurs qui, au premier son de cloche, volent à notre secours pour mieux nous contrôler, ce qui leur donne en retour le droit de nous traiter de « *shithole* » pendant que notre gouvernement et nous aussi, sommes demeurés impassibles face à un tel affront.

Nous avons dit plus haut que Dieu n'est nullement responsable de notre condition. C'est vrai! Les plus spirituels de ce monde pensent que la prière est leur seule porte de sortie. Grave erreur! Dieu nous a créés doués d'intelligence et de volonté. **Veillez et Priez** (Mat. 26 :41), et non l'inverse. L'ordre de ces deux verbes dans cette citation revêt une importance capitale. Si vous essayez de combattre le crime, la corruption, la misère, la carence en éducation, le banditisme, le viol, le vol, le kidnapping, l'insalubrité, le manque de soin dans nos hôpitaux, les détritus qui jonchent les rues de la capitale, la nonchalance dans nos industries, dans nos églises, dans nos entreprises, dans notre système politique et même dans notre mentalité que seulement par la prière, votre déception est garantie.

Pourtant, quelque précaire que soit notre condition de communauté, de peuple et de nation, il y a toujours un faible reste qui prouve que l'amalgame **Volonté + Action = Succès** se révèle être notre vraie porte de sortie. Nous pouvons, certes, éviter la catastrophe appréhendée si et seulement si la volonté d'agir constitue notre point de mire vers notre objectif.

Comme a dit la très connue physicienne française, Marie Curie, " *Dans la vie, rien n'est à craindre, tout est à comprendre* ". Faudrait-il connecter cette idée avec l'ultime assurance de Dieu qui nous dit : " *Je serai avec vous tous les jours* ", (donc rien à craindre)? Faudrait-il comprendre que dans un contexte de changement incontournable à tous points de vue au 21^{ème} siècle, notre survie dépend absolument des décisions prises dans un contexte global de renouvellement des idées, de concepts, de mentalité et de façon de faire adaptée à l'ère actuelle? Pensez-y!

Il n'est nullement différent pour nous, gens d'une même communauté chrétienne qui aspirent à servir Dieu dans un environnement digne, sain et agréable. Il serait avantageux pour nous tous, que nous nous mettions enfin au diapason (*disposition d'esprit conforme aux circonstances, en harmonie, en accord avec l'attitude ou les opinions d'autrui*) afin d'éviter d'être relégués au rang d'observateurs éhontés. Saint Augustin, ce philosophe et théologien chrétien romain eut à dire que " *la volonté est un bien, dont l'homme peut abuser certes, mais qui fait la dignité de l'homme* ". Oooh, quel paradoxe! Mais n'en faisons pas toute une histoire. Pour notre dignité d'homme et de serviteurs de Dieu, abusons donc de cette **volonté** alliée à l'**action**, et certainement le **SUCCÈS** sera au rendez-vous.
